All AIA meetings, lectures, workshops, charrettes, tours and programs are registered for AIA C.E. credits, and where possible HSW, and Sustainable credits as well. Architects are assisted in acquiring the credits they need through our programs as well as self-study, and other industry seminars, workshops and lectures.

Legislative Advocacy

As the collective voice for architects and design professionals in Southern Nevada, AIA Las Vegas monitors legislative activity on the local, state and federal levels and makes sure that the concerns and interests of architects are heard by key officials and legislators. Members and firms profit by our proactive legislative savvy and diligent monitoring of regulatory matters affecting the profession. The "Pencil Ready" campaign is currently working to encourage funding for infrastructure, and retro-fitting projects and educating legislators to the importance of design as the starting point for jobs.

Special Interest Resources and Committees

Each year the Chapter organizes and participates in outreach programs designed to benefit the community. Examples of these include "Habitat for Humanity", "Christmas in April", Nevada Homeless Youth, High School Design Awards, CANstruction on behalf of the Three Square Food Bank, and Architecture Week. In addition AIA committees provide special resources for Emerging Professionals and Young Architects, ARE programs for Interns and Associates, and Design Programs that foster appreciation for quality design.

Special Events and Fund-raising Activities

The Chapter hosts the longest continuously running annual **Golf Tournament** in Southern Nevada (37 years in 2010). In addition to being an excellent networking event for Architects and Allied members, it is a major fundraiser for the Chapter.

The annual **AIA Las Vegas Product Show** is also an important annual event that specifically spotlights our Allied Members and their products and services.

The statewide "**Excellence in Design and Distinguished Service Awards**" celebrates quality design across the state. In 2010 the event will be hosted by the AIA Northern Nevada Chapter.
